

Aboriginal heritage assessment.

All process must be contextually fair, transparent, genuine, accountable and have appropriate community engagement.

Process must not be rushed, incomplete, inconsistent, obfuscated or have unsuitable terms of reference.

Decisions must be based on objective, appropriate and reliable information which clarifies and confirms impact (if any) on existing residential or commercial use. Media publications associated with it must be factually and contextually accurate with no social engineering, scaremongering or selective quoting.

Contrary to existing social perception, native title and heritage assessment outcomes may not always result in adverse outcome for entities who exist within the area bound by the decision. In some situations traditional owners still feel that circumstances exist where clarity is required, eg
