Agriculture and general flora production plans must not exceed long term, sustainable water and other natural resource requirements, availability and capacity from localised sources. No point trying to expand food production if the local ecosystem can't support it.

Rushing often causes errors and creates problems, hence process must not be rushed, incomplete, inconsistent, obfuscated or have unsuitable terms of reference. Development plans and process must be contextually fair, transparent, genuine, accountable and have appropriate community engagement and support.

Decisions must be based on objective, appropriate and reliable information which clarifies and confirms impact (if any) on environment, and existing residential or commercial use. Publications associated with it must be factually and contextually accurate with no social engineering, scaremongering or selective quoting.

Policy must encourage and provide practical incentive for native flora use to minimise water consumption, reduce overall abnormal evaporation, and be in the best interest of long term, positive outcomes for the community.

I support sensible, sustainable, ecologically and economically responsible agricultural development for sustainable jobs in the Kimberley with Kimberley grown food for domestic and international export!
